Emergency Relief Fund Reporting-Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

1. On May 12, 2020, Cameo Beauty Academy signed and returned the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under section 18004(a)(1) of the Cares Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

2. A total amount of funds that the institution has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students: \$55,585.01

3. Cameo Beauty Academy distributed the following amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 1800(a)(1) of the CARES Act;
 - To date \$45322.35 was distributed to approximately 55 students.

4. 55 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 1800(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

Policy on distribution of CARES Grant funds to students

To address the pressing financial need of higher education schools due to the disruption of campus operations from coronavirus, Cameo Beauty Academy received a grant in the amount of \$55585.00 from the U.S. Department of Education. The funds must be used to cover expense related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus, including eligible expenses under a student's cost of attendance, such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care and childcare. Students attending must meet the following criteria to receive funds from this grant.

1. Only students who are or could be eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended (HEA), may receive emergency financial aid grants. If a student has filed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), then the student has demonstrated eligibility to participate in programs under Section 484(HEA). Students who have not filed a FAFSA but who are eligible to file a FAFSA, should do so immediately. The criteria to participate in programs under Section 484 of the HEA include but are not limited to the following:
 - U.S. citizenship or eligible noncitizen
 - Valid Social Security number
 - Registration with Selective Service (males only)
 - A high school diploma, GED or completion of high school in a homeschool setting.
2. Must be currently enrolled in a Title IV program
 - Students who took a "Leave of Absence" on or after March 13, 2020 are eligible, if the reason for the leave was related to COVID-19. The school must document the specific reason for the leave of absence to show that it was COVID-19 related.

3. Must have a graduation date after March 13, 2020

The school will distribute the funds to each eligible student based on the following formula: Total Aid over total enrollment. To be considered for assistance, students will need to complete a Student Certification Form.
